HULL GATES SHIPPING CO. LTD. Part 2 Graham Atkinson

Between 1979 and 1982 Hull Gates became the operators of ten tankers which were all built in Japan. These were split into two classes of four coastal tankers and two of 38,000dwt. The four 3,300dwt tankers perpetuated traditional names; WESTGATE and EASTGATE were registered under the ownership of Hull Gates while the second pair, NORTHGATE (3) and IRISHGATE (2). were taken on bareboat charter from two finance companies.

Hull Gates Shipping Co. Ltd., Hull Gates Shipping Management Ltd. and S.F. Craggs and Co. Ltd. continued to operate as before but in October 1982 the three companies were sold to Rowbotham Tankships Ltd., Turnbull Scott citing poor freight rates coupled with interest and repayment charges due on the ships.

Rowbotham had never renamed IRISHGATE (2), NORTHGATE (3), EASTGATE and WESTGATE in line with their other ships whose names traditionally ended in ...MAN although they spent time on the Isle of Man and Gibraltar registers in an attempt to make them more economical to trade. P&O Tankships Ltd. was purchased for £38.8m on 30 December 1996 by Barrow-based James Fisher and Sons plc who renamed the company James Fisher Tankships Ltd. Again the former Hull Gates ships retained their names, only changing funnel markings with each new ownership until 2003 and 2004 when they were sold to owners in the Mediterranean and West Africa. Both NORTHGATE (3) and EASTGATE, as well as the four ships built for the Norwegians, are still trading after creditable careers approaching 40 years each.

Since 1970 Rowbotham had been owned by United States companies, latterly New Jersey-based Marine Transport Lines which, in 1989, was subject to a management buyout. The new regime announced they would be looking for partners for their various operations, in particular one for Rowbotham. Consequently P&O Bulk Shipping took a 50% stake in Rowbothams for a reported £11.2m on 3 May 1990, purchasing the remaining 50% in January 1993 with the Rowbotham name disappearing with the company being renamed P&O Tankships Ltd.
