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GENERAL VESSEL INFORMATION:

On 4 July 2002, Greenpeace activists in inflatables from the Greenpeace ship MV Esperanza had boarded the 274 m long, 160,000 tonnes oil tanker, 'Crude Dio', in the Black Sea prior to its entrance to the Bosphorus Strait. Three climbers had hung a banner portraying the oil industry as a dinosaur destroying wind mills (renewable energy) with a message that read "STOP OIL INDUSTRY. CLEAN ENERGY NOW!". 13 activists had also occupied different parts of the tanker. Greenpeace had immediately contacted the captain of the tanker telling him that it was a peaceful protest and also informed the Turkish authorities, urging them not to let the oil tanker into the Bosphorous. 13 activists were taken into custody late at night after 11 hours of blockade. www.greenpeacemed.org.m
