#### **GENERAL VESSEL INFORMATION:**

1998: Danaos Shipping confirms that the company has bought the 2,700-TEU containerships HANJIN BREMEN, HANJIN ELIZABETH, HANJIN FELIXSTOWE, HANJIN HAMBURG, HANJIN KAOHSIUNG, HANJIN SINGAPORE and HANJIN VANCOUVER, all built in 1990 and 1991. The vessels are said to be sold for \$161m en bloc and chartered back to Hanjin. Brokers suggest that four of the ships will be acquired by Danaos itself and two by Drytank. The interests that will take the remaining vessel have not been revealed. (www.tradewindsnews.com/weekly/254776/greeks-grab-seven-more-hanjin-ships - 1998-05-29) Hanjin has sold seven containerships to Danaos Shipping Co. Ltd. For US\$ 23 mio each. Hanjin will charter them back on a bareboat basis for US \$ 17.000 daily for five years. The 2692 teu vessels are HANJIN BREMEN / HANJIN ELIZABETH / HANJIN FELIXSTOWE / HANJIN HAMBURG / HANJIN KAOHSIUNG / HANJIN SINGAPORE & HANJIN VANCOUVER. (World Maritime News - 29 May 1998)

2005: Aries Maritime Transport has exercised an option to purchase the 2,917-teu boxship CMA CGM SEINE (built 1990) from an affiliate of Aries Energy. Aries said the containership will continue to operate on its existing \$15,800 per day time charter with CMA CGM until September 2005. At that time the vessel will immediately commence a new five-year time charter with the French shipowner at a rate of \$20,400 per day, the Greek owner said.

2009: Plunging ship values pushed Aries Maritime further into the red during the fourth quarter as it was forced to make a hefty write-down against its container vessels. Falling charter rates for the 38,700-dwt Chinook (built 2001) and the 2,917-teu MSC SEINE also played a part. 2013: Hainan PO Shipping (HPOS) has ceased its container-shipping operations, the second major Chinese company to do so this year, says analyst Alphaliner. Alphaliner lists HPOS as still having four boxships, although it says these too have been idled in recent weeks. They are the 3,469-teu XIANG SHUI WAN (built 1993) and LONG MU WAN (built 1994), and 2,917-teu SHEN TOU WAN and XIN YING WAN (both built 1990).

2014: Hainan Pan Ocean Shipping (HPOS) has finally exited the boxship sector with the sale of its remaining vessels. The Chinese company has sold four units of 2,800 teu to 3,500 teu that have been idle in China since September 2013 after the company closed its intercontinental services, according to Alphaliner. The 2,917-teu SHEN TOU WAN and XIN YING WAN (both built 1990) fetched \$4m each from scrap buyers Zhoushan Changhong International Ship Recycling and Tianjin Tianma Shipscrap Engineering. They were were purchased from Greek owners in November 2009 for \$5.7m apiece.
