OWNER & FLAG HISTORY:

GENERAL VESSEL INFORMATION:

The next series of ships built for CARLINE was HOCKENHEIM & DONINGTON (former HUNAUDIERES & TERTRE ROUGE). These two sister ships were built in 1976 in Le Havre, at the same shipyard and with the same design as Estoril & Goodwood. However, with the experience of the previous vessels, as well as when taking into account the consequences of the first oil crisis (1973), it was decided to modify the original design by increasing the length by 5 meters, modifying the design of the bow and installing engines running on heavy fuel. It was a big change at that time, especially for the engineers, to have feeder vessels running on heavy fuel. The two vessels were employed on the same trade as the others in order to cope with the increased traffic of Renault to the Mediterranean, FIAT & FORD to the North Sea, and second hand cars for West Africa. These two vessels were in the early years also fixed for several trips to South America, loading in Europe for Buenos Aires and loading back trucks at Paranagua and VW at Santos, Brazil to Marseilles. <u>www.uecc.com</u> Last update: 27/8/2005
