#### **GENERAL VESSEL INFORMATION:**

Built by Setenave S.A., Setubal, Portugal, as hull No: S-109, the keel was laid on 26.04.1984, and the launching was on 03.09.1985 under the name "NACIONAL FIGUEIRA" (GRT: 22'889, NRT: 15'311, call sign: CSDE). Lloyds Register / IMO No: 7713149

On completion of the vessel on 31.03.1986, her Portugese owners, Companhia Nacional de Navegacao, Lisboa refused acceptance of the vessel for unknown reasons. The vessel was laid-up in the shipyard Setenave and offered her and the two sisters "NACIONAL FARO" (hull No. 107, launched 20.12.1984), and "NACIONAL FUNCHAL" (hull No. 108, launched 24.02.1985) for sale.

In November 1987 she was sold and her new owners became Stone Mountain Shipping Corp. and the management was given to Skaarup Shipping.(Asia) Ltd. (Skaarup Shipping Corp., Greenwich, CT, USA), who renamed her "KINGLAND" and put her under the flag of Vanuatu with port of registry being Port Vila. Official No: 279, call sign: YJWY2.

On 24.04.1990 on the approaches to La Coruña, Spain the vessel touched bottom and suffered damage to her starboard side, extending from hold No. 2 to the stern. After discharge of the cargo the ship proceeded on 09.05.1990 to El Ferrol for dry docking and repairs at the Astano Shipyard. She sailed again on 26.06.1990.

Apparently GSC, Georgian Shipping Company bought the vessel in summer 1990 after she was repaired in El Ferrol and she was renamed "AKAKI TSERETELI", according to one of Georgia's most famous writers, who lived from 1840 until 1915. The ship was put under the Soviet flag and was registered in the port of Batumi. GRT: 20'298, NRT: 14'682, official No: 12637, call sign: UQBA. Her sister vessel was the "David Agmashenebeli". After the collapse of the USSR in early 1992, the Georgian flag was hoisted, but without any changes in the registry in Batumi.

In March 1994 the vessel was taken over by A.G.G. Shipping Company Ltd, Valletta and commercial operation was by Anglo-Georgian Shipping Co., London. The ship was allocated to ABC Maritime AG for the technical management and was taken-over on 06.03.1994 in Gabes, Tunesia. She was renamed to "A TSERETELI" and was registered under the Maltese flag with home port Valletta GRT: 21'968, NRT: 13'033. Official No: 4017, call sign: 9HIU4.

06.02.1998: Sold to Tsereteli Shipping Co. Ltd., Valletta. The technical management was changed to Anglo-Eastern Management U.K. Ltd. (Denholm), Glasgow, UK and later on again to Columbia Shipmanagement Ltd., Limassol, Cyprus.

In January 2000 sold to Kirbar Gemicilik ve Ticaret A.S. (Management: Kiran Group of Shipping Companies (Kiran Makina ve Gemi Sanayii, Istanbul), Istanbul, and renamed "KIRAN PACIFIC" and registered under the Turkish flag. Official No: ? Call sign: TCWM. www.swiss-ships.ch

2004: **Grounded** amidships on reef **west of Reykjavik**, in lat 64 04.63N, long 22 08.88W, 26/6/2004. Holed in forepeak and No 1 ballast tank, some flooding.
