London, Feb 23 -- Following received from Australia RCC, timed 0002, UTC: C.c. **MSC DENISSE** (28,176 gt, built 1978) reported flooding in engine-room and pumps not operating in lat 11 13S, long 106 35E, at 2156, UTC, Feb 21.

The vessel reports it is in no imminent danger and is awaiting a tug, which is due on scene later today. (Note -- MSC Denisse sailed Singapore Feb 19 for Fremantle.)

London, Feb 23 -- Following received from Australia RCC, timed 0950, UTC: The tug en route to assist c.c. **MSC DENISSE** is still 24 hours away. The vessel's agent requested assistance from the Australian Navy to pump out water from the vessel and a navy vessel is proceeding from Christmas Island and should be on scene in approximately 30 minutes. On arrival it will attempt to patch MSC Denisse's leaking sea chest and pump out the water.

HMAS ARUNTA ASSISTANCE TO MV MSC DENISSE

The Royal Australian Navy Frigate, HMAS Arunta, is currently responding to an AUSSAR request for assistance to a container ship, MV MSC Denisse. MV MSC Denisse is drifting at sea, around 40 nautical miles south east of Christmas Island with a flooded engine room, without propulsion and only emergency power available. HMAS Arunta personnel are assisting the crew of MV MSC Denisse to pump water from flooded compartments in an effort to stabilise the container ship.

A SALVAGE tug from Singapore is due to reach the container ship MSC Denisse, stricken 40 nautical miles east of Christmas Island, this evening.

The 27-year-old ship, adrift and down at the stern, has been without power since a leak from the sea chest flooded the engine room on Tuesday. Australian frigate HMAS Arunta has been at the scene since yesterday, after being asked to assist with pumping out the flooded spaces. The ship's own pumps were not operational after the flooding, but the vessel told the Australian RCC that she was not in immediate danger.

The 1.366 teu **MSC DENISSE** was operating on MSC's South Africa/Indian Ocean/Fremantle service, and was due to arrive in Fremantle today, after sailing from Durban on January 30 and Mauritius on February 9.

Safmarine also operates slots on the service.

The 23,000-dwt ship was built in 1978, and was bought by MSC from CMA-CGM in 2001.

It is understood that the following vessels are earmarked for the modified "Capricorn" service commencing in April 2005:- MSC JAVA (19,573 gross tonnage, built 1993), MSC JESSICA (23,291 gross tonnage, built 1980), MSC FEDERICA (21,296 gross tonnage, built 1974), MSC MARIA (21, 586 gross tonnage, built 1985), **MSC DENISSE** (28, 176 gross tonnage, built 1977), MSC TERESA (22, 042 gross tonnage, built 1974) and MSC PAOLA (20,295 gross tonnage, built 1978).

Container M/V MSC DENISSE, Nhava Sheva Port to Gujarat Port, suffered water ingress 240km off the coast of Mumbai on May 15. The crew tried to stem the entry of water, but was unable to and alerted the manager of the vessel and agents who are based in Hong Kong. The ship's agents then reported the matter to the Maritime Rescue Co-ordination Centre (MRCC) of the Coast Guard and the Coast Guard Ship Vijaya, which was on surveillance patrol in the area, was diverted there. Another Coast Guard ship, the Subhadra Kumari Chauhan, was dispatched from the Naval Dockyard in Mumbai with a team of divers to assist in the repair of the vessel and the MRCC also alerted other merchant vessels in the area to provide assistance. When CGS Vijaya reached the location of the MSC Denisse in the early hours of May 16, the crew had begun preparations to abandon ship. The coast guard's team managed to locate the leak in the hold of the MSC Denisse and temporarily stop it. By 0800LT on May 18, the ship had become stable again and was handed over to the captain of the vessel. The coast guard teams returned to Mumbai by Saturday night and MSC Denisse and its crew proceeded to Gujarat. (May 20 2008)

Detained in 2004 in Fremantle (Australia) and in 2005 in Fremantle again and Tauranga (New Zealand). Sold for demolition to India. 270 \$ US per ton.
