According to Clarkson, the leading London shipbroker, just over 12,000 TEUs of containerships have been sold to breakers in the past couple of weeks. The majority were either owned or operated by Geneva based Mediterranean Shipping Co.

Most of the vessels being scrapped were built in the mid to late Seventies and early Eighties. Scrapping rates have fallen from USD 781 per long tonne paid by Bangladesh breakers for a 1977 built containership in early August to USD 535 paid for a 1981 built Zim vessel in early October to just USD 350 for the 1980 built **MSC FRIBOURG.**
