1986: Sold to Mapextra Ltd., Gibraltar and renamed KING WILLIAM.

1986: Acquired by Gino Gardella S.p.A., Genoa, Italy and renamed PACIFICO.

1991: Sold to Beazly River Maritime Ltd., Douglas, Isle of Man and renamed KING WILLIAM.

1991: Sold to Treasure Shipping Ltd., Valletta, Malta.

18.8.1991: Suffered structural failure while in ballast on a voyage from Setubal to Hampton Roads.

23.12.1991: Departed Hampton Roads towed by JUPERTIS for Malta, where she arrived 31.1.1992, for repairs.

4.9.1992: Sailed from Valletta for Piraeus and arrived there 8.9.1992 and was laid up.

1993: Sold to Seaobserver Shipping Ltd., Cyprus (Celestial Maritime Corporation, Athens, managers), and renamed PYTHAGORAS OF SAMOS.

24.10.1997: Stopped for Port State Control violations at Kotka, Finland, having arrived there 17.10.1997, and was then released for a ballast voyage to Constanza for repairs.

26.11.1997: Refused access to Barcelona having not arrived at Constanza for repairs.

5.12.1997: Reported to have been banned from all European ports which were signatories of the Paris Port State Control Memorandum for failure to proceed to a repair yard after leaving Kotka.

<mark>1997</mark>:

Vessel has been banned from all European ports & all countries that are members of the Paris Memorandum of Understanding on Port State Control. Vessel was detained at Kotka 24/10/1997 for safety violations and released 4 days later on the condition it would sail in ballast directly to Constanta for repairs. As the ship's classification certificates from RINA were to expire 30/11/1997 survey work was to be done at the same time. A ship repair facility recently informed Finland that the ship never arrived and RINA has cancelled its classification. On 26/11/1997 the vessel radioed the Port of Barcelona stating the ship would arrive in three hours. The port informed the ship it would not be able to enter and the vessel sailed on.
