GENERAL VESSEL INFORMATION:

1996: A deal in which Astilleros Espanoles-built ships were chartered to companies associated with Havana-based conglomerate and trading house Acemex has fallen apart following a dispute between the Spanish owner and Cuban charterer. Seven vessels owned by Naviera Castellana, the Madrid-based shipowning subsidiary of Astilleros Espanoles, have now been placed in receivership at the joint request of Naviera Castellana and Ulvik Management, a Limassol-based company understood to be linked to Acemex. The vessels - the CARVIK, CIENVIK, HAVIK, HONVIK, MANZAVIK, NUEVIK and SANCUVIK - are all general cargo vessels of about 16,250 dwt, built in the mid-1980s.

2013: Mumbai-based legal sources tell TradeWinds that three vessels sold for scrap – the 6,700-dwt reefer JI YANG (built 1983), 16,200-dwt cargoship MEEM (built 1986) and 14,200-dwt cargoship LILY NOBLE (built 1983) – have been arrested in the past two months, prior to beaching at Alang. The MEEM was held after Italian bunker supplier Omega Bunker SRL secured a Bombay High Court order last month to arrest the vessel over unpaid dues of around \$52,000. Both the JI YANG and MEEM continue to be under arrest

2014: The 16,200-dwt cargoship MEEM (built 1986) was said to have been sold last August for \$397 per ldt by United Arab Emirates (UAE)-based Marakeb SA to a GMS client, US-based Joplin Overseas Investment. It has been under arrest in India since then.

Contrary to GMS's claim that the Meem had been legally purchased by Joplin, the court order says that Marakeb has identified UAE-based Navamosa Navigation as the buyer. Navamosa will pay the creditors on behalf of Marakeb and will have the priority rights over the vessel, according to the court order. Meanwhile, the court has allowed the vessel to sail to Alang from Bhavnagar port but it will still remain under arrest until another hearing later this week.

2015: According to a court order of 25 February, the Bombay High Court has been entrusted with the job of overseeing the sale of the 16,200-dwt cargoship MEEM (built 1986). TradeWinds is told that the Bank of Sharjah claimed before the Supreme Court that, due to a collision with the 57,000-dwt ORIENTAL EXPLORER (built 2012) on 2 February, the MEEM suffered extensive damage. The ship was said to have been sold in August 2013 for \$397 per ldt by Marakeb to a GMS client, US-based Joplin Overseas Investment. However, it was arrested at Bhavnagar the same month after an order from the Bombay High Court over unpaid dues by Marakeb
