### **GENERAL VESSEL INFORMATION:**

Pacific International Lines (PIL) and Wan Hai Lines have started a new joint service to Europe linking Northport at Port Klang effective May this year. The service started with the maiden voyage of MV Kota Ganteng on 2 May, 2004.

MV Kota Ganteng will be followed by MV WAN HAI 303 on 9 May, 2004 for the westbound call whilst the eastbound call will start from 12 June 2004 by the same vessel.

The westbound service connects a total of nine ports with three in the Europe and six in Far East. On the Eastbound, the service links Antwerp, Port Klang, Singapore, Shanghai, Ningbo, Hong Kong, Shekou, Singapore and Port Klang before sailing to Europe. www.northport.com.my/northportFTP/ENews - May 2004

Pacific International Lines of Singapore (PIL) and Wan Hai Lines, Taipei will start a new joint service between the Far East and Europe. Their container vessels (capacity between 2400 and 2700 teu) will call Rotterdam on a weekly basis. The first vessel of PIL is expected to call Rotterdam on 20 May 2004. Wanhai's first vessel that calls the port of Rotterdam is the **WAN HAI 303**. This container vessel is expected on 30 May and has a length overall of 199 meters.

Yangming and Hapag-Lloyd buys slots on the (CMS) service

In addition to the new call at Bandar Abbas, Tuticorin is expected to be re-instated as a direct port call as early as May, after being dropped as an eastbound call back in October 2005

Service deployment is being changed through April/May by the deployment of faster vessels, including three of the Wan Hai 300 class, each capable of a service speed of 22 knots
